



HIGHLIGHTS

- California (CA) uses HPP funding to build and maintain a strong emergency preparedness and response foundation for the state's 39.5 million residents.
- The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) increased the efficiency of the resource request process through implementation of a cloud-based
- The CDPH enhanced staffing resource capabilities by matching available staff from contracting agencies to hospitals.

SPOTLIGHT ON PREPAREDNESS

The CDPH created a dashboard used to compile, view, and analyze data by geographic location. This dashboard provided the comprehensive data necessary to identify key health care insights at a glance and allow CDPH to make informed response decisions impacting health care facilities. This dashboard is an essential resource that will continue to benefit future emergency and disaster response across the state.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- The CDPH hosted weekly/biweekly calls with counties and regions to discuss trends, needs, and strategies.
- The CDPH enacted a public health order and a statewide transfer center to facilitate load balancing between hospitals to maximize utilization of staffed bed capacity throughout the state.
- The CDPH immediately provided temporary staffing resources to the hardest hit hospitals across the state.
