


HOSPITAL **PREPAREDNESS** PROGRAM

HIGHLIGHTS

- The District of Columbia (DC) uses HPP funding to improve its emergency preparedness and response foundation for its nearly 690,000 residents.
- The DC Health and Medical Coalition (HMC) collaborated with the Department of Homeland Security's Regional Resilience Assessment Program to improve risk management for National Capital Region (NCR) health care facilities.
- The DC HMC supported the development of a tiered Mass Causality and Trauma Patient Distribution Grid that has been implemented to support decision making during a declared Mass Casualty Incident (MCI).

SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE

To facilitate appropriate response measures during a burn incident in DC and to create a common operating picture across the NCR, the DC HMC developed a regional burn plan, known as the NCR Healthcare Coalitions Burn MCI Plan, and the DC HMC Burn Surge Annex. DC HMC created these resources in partnership with the northern Virginia and Maryland NCR regions as well as a variety of coalition stakeholders, including hospitals, clinics, fire and emergency medical services, and other DC agencies. This regional burn plan was tested with an NCR Healthcare Coalitions Burn Tabletop Exercise.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- DC HMC established the DC HMC Emergency Cache of Ventilators Deployment Annex based on lessons learned from the early months of the COVID-19 response.
- DC HMC coordinated and facilitated weekly stakeholder situational awareness teleconferences regarding response posture, vaccination efforts, epidemiological trends, health care guidance/policy regulations impacting health care facilities, and reopening metrics.
- The DC HMC and HPP team utilized data to coordinate the allocation and distribution of COVID-19 therapeutics and synthesized and shared hospital reporting metrics with senior policy makers, informing DC's reopening guidance.
